


2024 ANNUAL REPORT

As I reflect on 2024, I am filled with profound gratitude and pride for all we have accomplished together. Our vision—to ensure equitable access to a healthy life for everyone across Colorado’s Western Slope—has never been more urgent or more inspiring.



We're supporting equitable access to health.

In 2024, we awarded 274 grants totaling \$3,933,500, directly fueling progress and hope in our region. These investments empowered 190 extraordinary partners—organizations and leaders whose creativity, resilience, and unwavering commitment inspire us every day. From Durango to Hayden, and Cortez to Dillon, their work forms the very heartbeat of our mission.



We're listening.

Our investment portfolio remained strong, averaging \$85 million, and we maintained a responsible 6% spending rate—balancing immediate impact with long-term sustainability. This careful stewardship is made possible by our remarkable Board of Directors. Representing the full diversity and spirit of our region, our board members range in age from 31 to 81, with 34% identifying as nonwhite, and living in communities large and small all across the Western Slope. Their collective wisdom, lived experience, and leadership keep us both grounded and forward-thinking.

One of the greatest joys this year has been deepening our relationships with our grant partners. Through many Zoom conversations, we have listened, learned, and adapted together. Even at a distance, the connections we have forged are genuine, lasting, and important to us.


